



# NOT JUST A PHASE

## WHY TEEN MENTAL HEALTH DESERVES **ATTENTION**

Boon to some, bane to most—teen mental health is a pressing matter of the present. Teenage is the period when a child's fragility is at its peak, with the constantly developing changes in the body, way of thinking, and perceiving. This is the period when most children fall into the trap of societal pressure, parental pressure, and something that they hold dearly to their hearts, peer pressure. Facing bullying, personal fables, and insecurities are common to almost all teenagers.

When the developing teens are not paid attention to, and their mental health is overshadowed, they tend to fall into the traps of externalising behaviour, like self-harm, substance abuse, aggression, and delinquency (just to name a few). In recent surveys, it has been found that, in India, juvenile delinquency, defined as offences committed by individuals under 18, is a growing concern. According to NCRB data in 2019 shows that 75.2% of the juvenile offenders are involved in cases registered under both the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and special and local laws (SLL) between the ages of 16 to 18.

Estimated 38,685 were arrested, and 32,235 cases were registered, wherein 35,214 were under the IPC and 3,471 under the SLL. Actions like these not only hinder their growth but also disrupts their future. Teenagers with poor mental health are seen to be more prone to violence and delinquent behaviour in future.

An important role is played by the external environment of these teenagers. Abusive surroundings, demotivating peer group, and lack of belongingness altogether act as catalysts to this growing issue and further deter the mental health of children. Teenage mentality is crucial as teenagers are the future of the world: mothers, fathers, businessmen and entrepreneurs.

This is the time when we, as a part of society, need to pull up our socks and contribute to the growth of our future, our budding heroes, our teenagers.





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
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
